

KINDERGARTEN STUDENT SUPPLY LIST

2017-2018

Please bring these supplies (excluding the backpack) to Kindergarten orientation in August. If you will not be attending Kindergarten orientation, then please drop them off in the office before the first day of school.

YOUR CHILD WILL NEED: (Some of these materials will need to be replenished throughout the year.)

- ❑ **Please keep a change of seasonal clothes, in a Ziploc bag, in your child's backpack throughout the year.**
- ❑ A backpack, which should be labeled with your child's name
- ❑ A small snack **EACH DAY**. We eat lunch early, so snack time is each afternoon. You may send a drink. Snacks, napkins, or utensils will not be provided by the school
- ❑ Students will be having rest several times a week during the first nine weeks only. You may send EITHER a Kindermat OR a beach towel. They will be kept at school. Please write your child's name on the mat or towel. Do **NOT** send blankets, sleeping bags, pillows, or stuffed animals.
- ❑ 1 plastic, two pocket folder, WITHOUT metal prongs. Please label with your child's name
- ❑ A pair of blunt tipped **Fiskar** scissors (experience shows that children cut better with this kind). Please label with your child's name
- ❑ A hard, plastic crayon/pencil box (5 in. X 8.5 in.) labeled with your child's name

Please send the following. Do not label with your child's name, as these materials will be shared.

- ❑ Three boxes of 24 count Crayola crayons
- ❑ 2 fine tip black Expo markers for handwriting practice (these are the thin dry erase markers)
- ❑ 30 or more glue sticks to be shared amongst the class. (Kindergarten students tend to go through one glue stick a week)
- ❑ 1 package of Washable Crayola markers

Boys: 1 canister of disinfecting wipes and 1 box of tissues

Girls: 1 box or refill package of baby wipes and 1 bottle of hand sanitizer
